Our Club Development Team are here to be the first point of contact for Club Development related enquiries in Wales to enable them to grow and develop. We are also here to provide support as our community rugby clubs navigate the cost of living crisis.

We have recently made some structural changes in the team with the addition of a new role Head of Places to head up the team. Our experienced team are here to guide you depending on your needs and ambitions. To ensure our clubs are operating successfully, we want to work with Clubs to ensure that they are meeting minimum standards for operations and we will support volunteers with assistance in creating Club Development Plans.

We have Club Development Officers situated across Wales. We can support with signposting to the most appropriate grant funding, support with funding applications and assist teams with revenue generating opportunities to ensure that our clubs are fit for purpose and resilient for the long term future.

We will be issuing funding updates on a quarterly basis to keep clubs up to date with new and emerging grant and funding programmes across Wales.

Facility Development will be key to the growth of rugby in Wales and we recognise that access to good quality facilities are essential throughout Wales. Welsh Rugby Union sits on the Facilities Collaboration Group alongside Football Association of Wales and Hockey Wales to strategically place artificial surfaces throughout the Country. We can support clubs with the development and submission of applications to the WRU Facilities Grant and Pitch Improvement Programme.

Our Club Development Team are experts in Facility Planning and can assist you in ensuring that your club becomes a "Club of the Future" meeting the diverse needs of the communities in Wales.

The team will co-ordinate and deliver (where appropriate) club based education and training opportunities along with support and assistance for all club volunteers in off field roles.

Our team are experts in supporting clubs who are approached regarding asset transfer with their local authorities.

We are fortunate that we have access to a range of national corporate opportunities and we are able to promote those to all clubs who wish to participate.

We have a strategic view of each local authority and we are able to link clubs to other partners to promote collaboration and opportunities.

We are always looking for new volunteers in our game. There are numerous roles available and full training can be provided to undertake these roles.

The Female game in Wales has continued to grow since the return from the pandemic. The pathway to participation saw a large volume of females across Wales looking to join rugby outlets.

Overall, we have seen over 50% growth in the game compared to the pre pandemic registration figures. The WRU has further invested in the female game to support this growth and ensure our sides continue to grow.

This investment has seen the increase in dedicated staff to the community female game from 3 Gamechangers to 5 Rugby officers for the female game. This move has increased coverage areas with one officer dedicated to a rugby region. Several clubs have reached out surrounding setting up of a female outlet at their club in the future. To ensure the safe growth of the female game in Wales the WRU has regulations that ensure a minimum standard is met before setting up any female team to play competitively or recreationally. Our key responsibility as a Department is creating safe environments to enable rugby to thrive across Wales. It is essential as clubs that you register all required roles on My WRU. The roles that are required to be registered are: Coach, Referee, Player, Club Operations Manager, Team Manager and First Aider.

We are pro-active in providing Anti-doping and Integrity Education programme (Stay onside). We will continue to deliver our WRU Safeguarding Course – Don't tackle it Alone. We will be working with Club Operations Managers to maintain safe environments and support clubs in the creation of new rugby activities. We have further responsibilities with regards to injury surveillance and match day protocols linked to our values and behaviours.

We will continue to provide support with regards to first aid and medical services including training where required.

We are committed to working with our Club Safeguarding Officers to ensure that all roles in regulated activity are appropriately risk assessed utilising the Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS).

WRU APPRENTICESHIP SCHEME


We run a highly successful twelve month apprenticeship enabling our young people in Wales to have access to multiple opportunities within that period. The apprenticeship application window is usually between June and August.
